- ▶ How to select and use the most appropriate tools to locate pipe and find leaks

- ▶ How to get a handle on and reduce water loss
- ▶ What should be in your pipe and leak location tool box

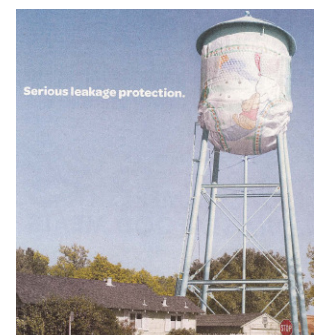
